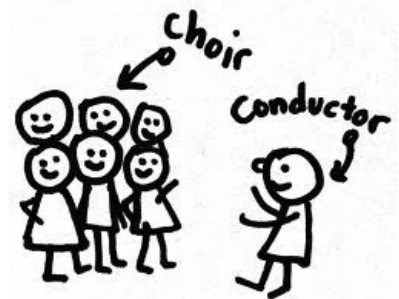

Presentations included "Trees for WASP" Project by Myrle Mackintosh, Chair of Women's History & Resource Center. Myrle expressed her thanks to all that attended the successful WASP (Women Air force Service Pilots) Memorial Grove dedication ceremony that was held on Thursday, November 10, 2011 at Brea-Olinda High School. The ceremony was attended by dignitaries, from the Governor, Senators, County Supervisor to the Mayor and many CFWC Orange District members. The project implemented the planting of twelve California Pepper trees representing the twelve Women Air Force Service Pilots from Orange County, along with the mounting of a bronze plaque displaying the name of all twelve WASP with their Congressional Medal of Honor, and the WASP motto "We live in the wind and sand... and our eyes are on the stars".



Guest speaker Mr. Barton Harlan, Chairperson of the Grand Jury Recruitment & Orientation Committee gave an explanation of the purpose, the organization, and the legal process of applying for the Grand Jury. ATTENTION SHOPPERS

According to Save A Tree, it takes one 15-to-20 year old tree to make enough paper for only 700 grocery bags.

PAPER OR PLASTIC?

Plastic shopping bags are often more convenient than paper—but they're not degradable (even the "biodegradable" plastic bags never completely disappear—they just break up into little pieces), and all plastic is made from petroleum, a non-renewable resource. Plastic bags often wind up in the ocean

and kill marine animals that get tangled up in them or swallow them. The ink used on plastic bags contains cadmium, a toxic heavy metal. So when printed plastic bags are incinerated, heavy metals spew into the air.

Paper Bags are reusable and biodegradable, but don't come ecologically cheap, either. Supermarket bags, for example, are always made from virgin paper—never recycled—because, manufacturers say, heavy loads require the long fibers in virgin pulp. Check the

printing on the supermarket shopping bag—it might say "recyclable," but it won't ever say "recycled."

SIMPLE THINGS TO DO

Think twice before taking any bag if your purchase is small. If every American shopper took one less bag each month, we could save hundreds of millions of bags every year. Even better bring a cloth bag when you shop.

This is the appetizer Pat Moore brought to the November 10th Home & Garden event at Standing Ovation. Many of you have asked for the recipe so we've included it here for you to try at home for the holidays. Yummy!

Artichoke Appetizer

4 slices bacon
1 15 oz. can artichokes, drain/chop
1 med. onion, chopped.
1 clove garlic, chopped
4 eggs, beaten
8 oz. Swiss cheese, shredded
¼ C. bread crumbs
 Oregano to taste

Fry bacon 'til crisp along with the onion and garlic. Then drain.

In a bowl combine & mix well:

Bacon mixture plus Eggs, artichokes, cheese, bread crumbs, and oregano

9 x 13 pan greased Oven 375 degrees Bake 25-30 minutes or until set.

Pour into pan and bake.

Let stand 5 min. before cutting.

Options; crab or shrimp can be used instead of artichokes.


